To stay safe, students have to sit in their seat and not move around the bus. The bus ride may also take a long time to get to school or go home. This Power Card uses the student's special interest in firemen to help support riding the bus safely.

Fireman Steve really enjoys being a fireman. When he is riding in the fire truck, he has trouble when other firemen are talking loudly. He has trouble staying in his seat when he sees other firemen standing up. Fireman Steve knows that if the firemen get too loud and he doesn't stay in his seat, he could fall and hurt himself. He knows if he falls and hurts himself, he can't be a fireman. To help Fireman Steve stay safe and remember to stay in his seat, he listens to music, uses a fidget and keeps his seat belt on.
