Remote Learning


Remote learning can be challenging for some individuals, particularly those with ASD. This example is written for a student who is having difficulty preparing for remote learning. The student often needs verbal reminders from his family members on the steps needed to log in to his computer to check in with his teacher. The student loves outer space, particularly astronauts. The following scenario and Power Card were created to help this student learn the steps to prepare for remote learning.

Astronaut Andy and his team sometimes communicate through technology. Both he and his NASA team need training and education to learn new skills. Before Astronaut Andy can prepare for his day, he needs to log in to his computer to access the International Space Station. Astronaut Andy learned the steps to prepare for his day with his team and he wants you to be ready for your school day, even when it's online.

Astronaut Andy wants you to remember:

- Log into your computer to check in
- Read emails or messages from your teacher
- Email your teacher if you have questions
- Complete your assignments
